Saints urgently needs a wall around the perimeter for security and to provide an environment that is safe and conducive to learning.

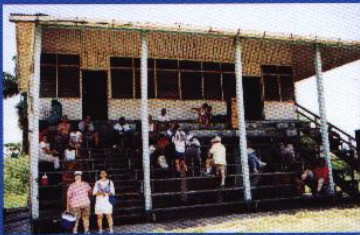

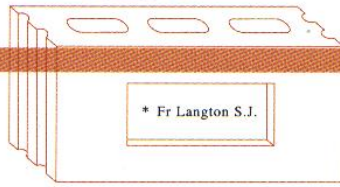

WHAT IS THE WALL OF FAME?

A new brick fence around the perimeter of the College grounds at Brickdam. On each brick will be emblazoned for posterity the name of each contributor. Alumni can also display their years at Saints or their graduating year.

WHY IS IT NECESSARY?

Immediately, security at St. Stanislaus College needs to be strengthened for the benefit of the student body and the staff. In the longer term, the College needs financial support to ensure its survival as a quality school.

WHERE WILL FUNDS BE RAISED?

Worldwide! Anywhere in the world where there are Guyanese or friends of Guyana who care about education in Guyana in general or at Saints in particular.

WHEN WILL THE PROJECT START?

The building of the wall will begin only when the total amount required for its construction has been raised.

WHEN WILL IT BE COMPLETED?

The wall itself will be completed within months of the money being raised, but the project will continue. After the initial campaign, we will conduct annual campaigns to raise funds for other needs by continuing to add names to the Wall of Fame.

CURRENT EXECUTIVE TORONTO CHAPTER - BACKGROUND

The St. Stanislaus College Alumni Association – Toronto was founded in 1993. Since its inception the Association has provided:

- equipment for use at the college
- assistance to students and teachers
- resources to carry out renovations to the college buildings.

These projects have cost in excess of \$100,000CDN.

The projects include:

- one of the most modern computer labs in Guyana
- supplies for the science labs
- staff scholarships to the University of Guyana
- aid for student uniforms
- repainting of the new wing
- repairing the roof and the ceiling of the new wing
- refurbishing washrooms

The Association recognizes the importance of our efforts to the current students. These students will be the next generation to carry the torch.

CURRENT EXECUTIVE BARBADOS CHAPTER - BACKGROUND

The St. Stanislaus College Alumni Association – (Barbados) was founded in 1995. Since its inception, the chapter has assisted by sending 3 shipments of textbooks, donated by Harrison College, Barbados, with transportation costs borne by John Fernandes Ltd. A twinning arrangement between Saints and Harrison College is currently in the process of formation. It hosted the Saints Scout Troop in 1996, providing foodstuffs, transportation, exit taxes and donated a Trophy to be presented on Prize Day to the student with the best average in the lower school. It is presently exploring other ways of assisting our Alma Mater.

CURRENT EXECUTIVE GUYANA CHAPTER - BACKGROUND

The St. Stanislaus College Association was formed on September 21st, 1942 when the college's survival was doubtful. The Government had refused to provide financial subsidies and the critical financial situation was making it impossible to continue. To prevent closure a group of "old boys" who had been working with Father Gill to raise funds for the newly acquired sports ground by the Sea Wall, decided to form the association. The group's efforts, under the guidance of John Fernandes Sr., the first president, ensured the survival of the college. To this day, the association continues to work for the betterment of the college. In November 1998, the association passed resolutions changing the rules governing name and membership. It is now called the "St. Stanislaus College Old Students' Association."
