St. Stanislaus College Students perform well at GCE, CAPE, CSEC exams

Seven St. Stanislaus College students are among the top performers at the General Certificate of Examinations (GCE), receiving Grade As and Bs.

Four St. Stanislaus students are also among the top Caribbean Proficiency Examinations (CAPE) achievers, obtaining Grades One and Two, and six are high scorers at the Caribbean Secondary Education Certificate (CSEC) exams, a press release from the St. Stanislaus Board said.

At the GCE, the top achievers are Michon Sukhoo-Pertab, Deokumar Lachhman, Michael George, Veronica Griffith, Jason Griffith, Avinand Rampersaud and Suresh

Charles. They all obtained Grade A and B passes.

Obtaining Grades One and Two at CAPE are Anjanie Ramlall, Suresh Charles, Swarsatti Bharrat, and Michon Sukhoo-Pertab.

Meanwhile, Romeo Isaacs is St. Stanislaus College's top CSEC student, acquiring ten Grade Ones, with three of them being distinctions. Rukhmini Nauth achieved seven Grade Ones, while Mahendra Saywack and Aneisha Lewis secured six Grade Ones, and Sara Diaram and Sheromanie Harkishun five Grade Ones each.

Additionally, there were 100% passes in 11 subjects.

Very encouraging reports from Saints

As a new school year begins at Saints, the first under the direction of the Board of Governors, all indications are that the dedication and the hard work invested by the Board and members of staff, have been well worth it. A report (below) from Chairman Chris Fernandes indicates that a new optimism is in the air at Saints, on the part of students, staff, and also parents.

Dear Des and Rupert,

Thanks for your financial support in the refurbishment of the Second Form class rooms and conversion of the old canteen to a new bookroom. Thanks also for the material used in the reconstruction of the staff room which has been very well received by the staff.

We have successfully completed our first week of the new school term. It has been a most encouraging experience, and I must confess that for the first time there is evidence that we have made an impact on the quality of Education being delivered at Saints. It has taken us almost one year building relationships with the staff, having organized two successful workshops. Our efforts were rewarded when at a meeting on the 8th September with the parents of Forms 2 to 6, we had a ninety percent turn out of staff. The parents too were most receptive, and the mood at the conclusion of the meeting of both the parents and staff was unbelievably positive and appreciative of the work done so far by the Board.

What has helped immensely in our success has been the appointment of Mr. Wendell Archer as the Administrator. Wendell himself is an old boy who graduated in 1966. He has taught all of his life and retired in 2004 at the age of 55 as the Deputy Head Teacher of the Cyril Potter Teachers Training College. His supervision of our pre-school preparation was extremely helpful, and having a representative at the College on a daily basis is invaluable. He knows the Education System and can relate to what we know as a Jesuit Education.

We have a number of new teachers appointed, some of whom are former students. Discussions have been held with the Bishop and the newly appointed local Jesuit Supervisor with respect to the recruitment of Jesuit priests to teach Science and Maths at the College in the Sixth Forms. They are both very receptive, and we are hopeful that we may get assistance next year. We are pleased to report that we are in discussion with a Jesuit scholastic who is in Guyana for one year and who is willing to assist in the teaching of IT and English Literature. We are hop-

ing to have his appointment confirmed shortly.

Book Lists have been issued to students of all levels. Books are supplied by the Ministry for the core subjects, but parents do have to buy for the remaining subjects. We are waiting to see how many may not be able to afford them before considering what assistance we may be able to offer with your help. If we did get involved in providing some books, we would have to introduce some measure of a security deposit and arrangements to ensure the recovery of the books at the conclusion of the school year.

With the assistance of Alfred Bulai, a former student of the College who was head of the Science Department at Saints for a number of years, we plan to have inventories of the Labs done and documented. Alfred is also expected to review the syllabuses of the Physics, Chemistry, and Biology classes and to provide us with a list of our needs which we will share with you.

We will also seek advice on the setting up of our Modern Language Lab. For your information, Mr. Maynard is no longer with us. He has resigned effective 1st Dec. and may well be on leave between now and then. When we obtain the above information we would communicate further with you.

This term, as you know, is athletics. We have explained to both the parents and students the importance of sport in producing well rounded individuals. The Sports Subcommittee has already had a number of meetings, and we are confident that Sports 2006 will be a tremendous improvement on what students have been accustomed to at Saints.

Even the teachers seem enthusiastic. It is scheduled for the GCC on 5th Oct. We will arrange for a comprehensive report, photographs, etc., to be forwarded.

This weekend, the President has announced his new Cabinet. Dr. Henry Jeffery is now the Minister of Foreign Trade. Mr. Shiek Baksh, former Minister of Housing and Water, is the new Education Minister. Dr. Desrey Fox has also been assigned the newly appointed post of Minister within the Education Ministry. Not sure what that means but we will explain when her responsibilities become clear. We will have a meeting with the new team as early as possible so as to ensure the continuity of their support.

We are asking that we be given until January to decide on the question of the ISO 9000 certification programme. While we are encouraged by recent developments, we want to be certain that we do not waste anyone's

Welcome to two new members of the 2007 Executive

A Profile of Godfrey Whyte, Asst. Secretary, SSCAAT

On behalf of the members of the St. Stanislaus College Alumni Association, Toronto, we welcome Mr. Godfrey Whyte, both as a new member and to the Executive Committee. He attended his first meeting of the Association on 28 September last, which happened to be our Annual General Meeting, and was elected to the position of Assistant Secretary.



Godfrey attended Saints from 1961 to 1968, when he graduated with French, Latin and English Literature at 'A' level. His best subjects were French and Latin for which he gives great credit to his First Form Latin and French teacher, Mr. Stanley (Marko) Marques, who had an inimitable style of teaching and classroom management; he would let the class know that he was very willing to pull off his belt and whip troublesome boys on their "bare, bare bottoms". Godfrey was so scared of Marko that he decided, very early, that the only way to preserve his 'bottom' was to concentrate on his

French and Latin studies. He also intensely disliked turning up for detention on a Saturday morning in full school uniform, as was the norm in those days. He became so proficient in language and literature that he won a French Government scholarship in 1969 to study French and Applied Linguistics at L'Universite de Besancon, France (1969-1973).

Upon finishing L.es L and M.es.L degrees he returned to Guyana where he taught at Queen's College for a short while. Then, in 1974, he left Q.C. to teach French full time at the University of Guyana. He remained there until 1980, when he moved to Jamaica to teach French at the University of the West Indies. Between 1981 and 1993, Godfrey not only taught French at U.W.I., but he was able to update his knowledge in Applied French Linguistics and Descriptive Linguistics at Indiana University on a Fulbright scholarship, gaining Masters' degrees in both areas. In 1993, he returned to Bloomington, U.S.A., to branch into studies in Instructional Systems Technology. He completed the course work for a PhD in 1996 before moving to Toronto where he is now an employee of the Toronto District School Board.

He has great admiration and fond memories of the dedication of the many Jesuit and lay members of staff he encountered at Saints and appreciates most of all their emphasis on the formation of character. *Salve, Godfrey!!*

A profile of Frank B. Delph

At our recent AGM, on 28 September, 2006, the outgoing President, Des Jardine, welcomed Frank Delph, as the newest member, to his first meeting of the SSCAAT. Later that night, the newly elected President, Art Veerasammy, congratulated Frank on his election to the position of Vice President on the new Executive Committee.



Frank is a native Lindener, who was born at Wismar (Linden), and who lived in the bauxite town of Mackenzie until he was about 8 years old. It was around that time that his parents decided to move to the 'big city', George-

town, so he could attend Mr. Dolphin's private school. After just three years there, he was enrolled into 2A at St. Stanislaus College.

Frank fondly remembers his school days at Saints where Fr. Smith was then Principal and the Jesuit teaching staff included Frs. Marques, Boase, Gill, Scannell, Lynch, Feeney, and Earle. Messrs Yhap, Denny and Compton Singh comprised the 'lay' teachers. However, he has one 'unhappy' memory: the time when his stay at Saints was almost suddenly and unceremoniously cut short. Frank was in Fourth Form when, during a Religious Doctrine class taught by Fr. Gill, he was brazen enough to "rhetorically question the Church's position with respect to Communism". Fr Gill immediately told the young Frank that "if I had my way, you would be expelled immediately!" Fortunately for Frank, Fr. Gill did not have his way then, and Frank went on to become Head Prefect from 1951 until he graduated in 1953.

Some of Frank's close school chums included Jimmy Kranenburg, Leslie Cummings, Stanley Greaves, Gerrard Bailey, and Raymond Pancham. Together, they often 'hung-out' at Mount Eagle for mauby and white-eye, and Ferraz's for pourie, potato balls and Canada Dry!

Upon graduating from Saints, Frank joined the Government Service as an apprentice Surveyor in the then-recently formed Drainage and Irrigation Department of the Ministry of Works and Hydraulics. He worked there for 8 years before leaving to join the Demerara Company. Three years later, in September 1964, accompanied by his wife, Mary, and their two children, Frank jr. and Diane, he immigrated to Canada.

On arrival here, he decided to pursue further studies to obtain his professional licence in order to conduct land

surveys in Ontario, followed by a commission, which permits him to practise land surveying anywhere in Canada. Consequently, he holds the professional designations: O.L.S. and C.L.S.

Between 1964 and 1984, Frank worked his way up to Management, holding such positions as Manager of Legal Surveys and Support Services. Then, in 1985, Frank was invited by one of the partners, for whom he worked, to establish their own company, Monaghan Delph Limited. That partnership lasted for five years, until Frank established his present company, Delph and Jenkins Limited, in 1990. He is now the President of his successful company of land surveyors and he looks at least ten years younger than his real age!! *Salve*, Frank.


